Vance Air Force Base

Vance Air Force Base is responsible for training Air Force and allied student pilots for worldwide deployment and Aerospace Expeditionary Force support. The wing reports to 19th Air Force, which falls under the Air Education and Training Command. The base is named after Lt. Col. Leon R. Vance, a local World War II hero and Medal of



Honor recipient. Originally a flight school that trained more than 9,000 pilots for the Army Air

Corps between 1941 and 1945, the base was activated Jan. 13, 1948, within the Air Training Command of the newly formed Air Force. Vance was the first base in AETC to have extensive civilian contractor support for base functions ranging from aircraft maintenance to fire department to child care services. The support contract began in 1960 with Serv-Air.
