




**For recreational users (fly for fun):**

The Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) requires all recreational Unmanned Aircraft System (UAS) operators to contact the air traffic control tower or airport operator prior to operating their UAS within 5 nautical miles of an airport. UASs include, but are not limited to, model aircraft, “drones,” and quadcopters.

If you would like to request to fly a drone for recreational use within 5 NM of Vance (map for Vance and Kegelman below), you may submit your request to [Vance.Drone.UAS.Request@us.af.mil](mailto:Vance.Drone.UAS.Request@us.af.mil) or call (580) 213-7820 for more information

All recreational UASs are restricted from operating in the UAS flight hazard areas depicted in red on this map due to safety concerns with routine Vance AFB flight operations.



Recreational UAS operators flying outside of these hazard areas but within 5 NM of Vance (red ring on map below) may fly a recreational UAS up to 200 feet Above Ground Level (AGL) without interfering with Vance AFB flight operations.



**For commercial users (fly for work):**

Commercial operators wanting to fly in Vance's Class D or E airspace may [Request a Waiver/Airspace Authorization](#) on the FAA website.

**For both:**

As a reminder, all UAS flight operations including Public, Civil, and Model Aircraft, are prohibited within the airspace over Vance AFB and Kegelman AUX from the surface to 400 feet above the ground in accordance with UAS NOTAM FDC 7/7282. However, special permission may be requested by completing the form at [https://www.faa.gov/uas/request\\_waiver/](https://www.faa.gov/uas/request_waiver/)
